- China's foreign economic policies;
- China's exchange rate, monetary, and fiscal policies and related impacts;
- Trade conflicts, disputes, and issues between China and other economies;
- WTO and China;
- Protectionism and financial crisis;

Please send the draft of a paper or an extended abstract to Xiaopeng Yin <xyin_ca@yahoo.com>. The deadline for receiving submission is April 30, 2010. We prefer to receive one submission by one person, unless different papers will be presented by different co-authors.

Please include in your submission your name, e-mail address(es), affiliation, and mailing address. For joint papers, please include the relevant information of ALL co-authors.

To encourage interactions among participants, the Center is setting up a visiting program during the time of the conference. Participants of the conference are invited to stay at UIBE for a longer period of time (before/after the conference); e.g., one week or two weeks, with the conference included in the period. Accommodation and office space, subject to availability, will be provided to some visiting scholars.
